A proposal for a new work item shall be submitted to the CROSQ Secretariat, which will assign it a reference number and process the proposal in accordance with the CROSQ Directives. The proposer of a new work item may be a member state of CROSQ via the National Standards Bureau, a regional technical committee or subcommittee, the Council on Trade and Economic Development, (COTED), the CROSQ Council, The CROSQ Executive Committee, the CROSQ Secretariat, or a national, regional or international organisation recognized by the CROSQ Council. Guidelines for proposing and justifying a new work item are given in the CROSQ Directive - Procedure for the Management of the Technical Work of CROSQ (DRAFT).

Draft CARICOM Voluntary Sustainability Standard for Coconuts and Coconut Products.

Scope of the proposed deliverable.

This standard specifies the sustainability requirements for the production of fresh and dry coconuts, water coconuts, coconut oil and products of processed coconut such as desiccated coconut.

This standard does not apply to:

- a) coconut plants
- b) other products, food or non-food where the coconut is used only as a flavouring.

Purpose and justification of the proposal.

The aim of this standard is to provide the producers of coconuts and coconut products in the CARICOM region with guidance on desirable sustainability metrics that will ensure sustainable development and future viability for the regional coconut value chain This is desirable:

- 1. For Coconut Products such as coconut oil seeking entry into food and non-food markets where sustainable products are wanted and valued.
- 2. To increase producers and processors incomes through sales in such new markets.
- To reap the benefits of improve environmental management in the CARICOM region and reduce the impact of climate change, where possible, thereby improving the long term viability of the coconut industry in the region.
- 4. To reap the benefits of better social conditions in the CARICOM region and renewing interest in production of coconuts.
- 5. To facilitate the use of a Caribbean Sustainability Mark, which would identify sustainably produced CARICOM Coconut Products. The use of such a market based instrument would facilitate sustainable consumption/use and develop high value international markets, while encouraging sustainable production and processing activities in CARICOM territories.
